

Share Your Work on Housing and Community Development

Be part of the Virtual Poster Session at the Joint Center for Housing Studies' September 25th symposium: In Pursuit Of Equitable Development: Lessons From Washington, Detroit, and Boston

Students who have done recent work on affordable housing, community development, and other topics related to equitable development in low-income neighborhoods and communities of color are invited to share their work with the diverse group of people who will attend a virtual symposium being organized by the Harvard Joint Center for Housing Studies, co-sponsored by the Harvard Graduate School of Design Department of Urban Planning and Design and the Loeb Fellowship.

Information about student work done in courses, fellowships, and/or internships will be shared on the event website. Students should be available to discuss their work in two virtual poster sessions that will occur during the symposium: 2:00-2:30 pm ET (during a break between panels) and 4:30-5:00 pm ET (following the final panel). Each student presenter will be assigned a table in <u>Remo</u>, an online platform (separate from Zoom) that makes it easy for people to have informal, virtual conversations. (We will provide guidance for those unfamiliar with Remo.)

This opportunity is open to students at the Harvard Graduate School of Design, the Harvard Kennedy School, other Harvard graduate schools, and to students from schools and programs associated with other speakers at the symposium, including the University of Michigan's Taubman College of Architecture and Urban Planning and Howard University's Architecture Department.

- **Personal information**: Name, school, program, expected graduation date, and link to a bio (if available)
- Project title and summary: Short description of the work (maximum 250 words)
- **Project information**: Link to more detailed information about the project (e.g. presentation slides, a detailed write-up, etc.). If nothing is available online, please send additional materials that we can post about your project.
